










If we want to be in these buildings for another 20, 50 or 109 years then...

When is the best time to plant a tree?

Answer: 20 years ago

In 2000 (17 years ago), we had a \$40 million list of improvements we needed/wanted.

The priority was space for the enrollment spike.

We asked for and spent more than \$20 million on additional space and finishes.

Thank goodness, look at all the shade from that tree!

We deferred \$20 million of work primarily in infrastructure (behind the walls).

DIFFERENT SYSTEMS ASSESSED BY ARCHITECTS AND ENGINEERS


















RENEWAL INDEX %

How much will we spend to maintain our buildings over time compared to the cost to build a new building of the same size?


